I've spent much of my life chasing something just beyond reach, constantly comparing myself to a false idea of perfection. But *Little Women* reminded me that there's beauty in imperfection, in the trying, the almost, the becoming. Even in the chasing, there is grace. Every rehearsal has shown me glimpses of real sisterhood.

May this story leave you braver, warmer, and a little more in love with the beautiful imperfection of growing up, and with the people who help you do it.






